The proclamation by the Province of Ontario of June as Italian Heritage Month honours the contribution of the Italian immigrants who first settled throughout the vast province, their lives and achievements, and those of their descendants, who now number more than one million. Italian Canadians are present in every aspect of Ontario society: culture, commerce, civic service, political leadership, healthcare, education, to name just a few. They are committed parents, neighbours, friends, and co-workers, who generously and proudly share the gifts of their heritage.
